### Hergo Sun Japan KK starts the construction of 1,2 MW solar PhotoVoltaic plant in Japan

Tokyo, January 8 2016 - *Hergo Sun Japan KK, a subsidiary of Infrastrutture Group, selected by Mega Solar Power Committee of Chichibu Municipality, Saitama Prefecture, starts the construction of 1,2 MW solar PhotoVoltaic plant in Japan.*



"The construction has been started since few weeks and this is the first photovoltaic plant built by an Italian company in Japan. It will go into production in March 2016 and will provide power for about 1.000 families.
